Blau, Counsel in the firm's Environmental Department, will lecture on issues related to climate change, disaster law and emergency preparedness at the New Jersey State Bar Association Construction Law Section's CLE Dinner Meeting on September 13, 2017. Ms. Blau will discuss legal approaches relating to climate adaptation as part of the meeting programming.
