

Discharge Prevention Program: Compliance in NJ

Roth, a partner in the Environmental Department in Greenbaum, Rowe, Smith & Davis LLP's Woodbridge Office, will be a panelist at the seminar, "Discharge Prevention Program: Compliance in NJ." The program is sponsored by Rutgers University New Jersey Agricultural Experiment Station and will be held on May 21, 2013.

The one-day workshop will provide guidance on preparing updates to current Discharge Prevention Containment and Countermeasure (DPCC) and Discharge Cleanup and Removal (DCR) plans, and steps to ensure compliance with the plans and NJDEP rules. Also for discussion is the federal Spill Prevention, Control and Countermeasure (SPCC) "sister" program and how discharges will be addressed under the new Remediation of Contaminated Site rule to be adopted this year.

Mr. Roth has a concentration in real estate, environmental, and health and safety law, with a special emphasis on compliance counseling and the environmental aspects of real estate and business transactions.
