Parking-related issues drive land use applications, especially in multifamily, mixed use and redevelopment projects. However, not only do the parking requirements in the Residential Site Improvement Standards (RSIS) technically supersede local parking ordinances and even site specific parking standards in redevelopment plans, but the requirements haven't been updated in 25+ years.

This webinar will take a deeper dive into some contemporary issues related to parking – the centrality of parking to land use applications; economic implications and the cost of parking; the impacts of Uber/Lyft and other ridesharing services on parking demand; potential impacts to parking demand in a post-Covid world; varying municipal approaches and the continuing need (if any) for statewide uniformity of residential parking standards.
