The year 2024 has been especially significant for residential real estate practitioners, with many changes that directly affect the practice. Mr. Hennessey will lecture on the Real Estate Consumer Protection Enhancement Act, which took effect on August 1, 2024, requiring new responsibilities for brokerage firms, buyers' agents, sellers' agents and anyone who helps consumers buy and sell real estate.
