Mr. Flynn and Mr. Roth's presentation will cover the proposed rule's background and provisions, likely timelines for the rule's implementation, and guidelines on how best to prepare and comply with this new set of EPA regulations.

Topics to be addressed include:

- Identifying how existing hazardous waste regulations differ from the proposed rule for pharmaceuticals
- Evaluating whether and how the key elements and requirements of the proposed rule apply to particular facilities
- Deciding if particular materials meet the definitions of pharmaceutical
- Developing a compliance strategy ahead of the EPA's release of its final rule on hazardous waste pharmaceuticals
