Mr. Goodman concentrates his practice in real estate and real estate brokerage issues, as well as antitrust suits, corporate shareholders' and partnership disputes and municipal law. He is a frequent lecturer and author on legal issues for REALTORS®. He serves as General Counsel for and is past president of the United Way of Hunterdon County. Mr. Goodman is a former trustee of the Trial Attorneys of New Jersey and former chair of the Interest on Lawyers' Trust Accounts (IOLTA) Fund of the Bar of New Jersey. He is the recipient of the 2006 Rutgers University Alumni Meritorious Service Award and a past president of the Rutgers-Newark Law School Alumni Association.
