



## Constitutional Issues that May Arise When Employees Return-To Work from Covid-19 to be Discussed by Tom Bradley of Laner Muchin at 36th Annual Illinois Public Sector Labor Relations Law Conference

Chicago, IL –The constitutional issues posed when employees return to work from COVID-19 will be the topic of a presentation by attorney Tom Bradley, of Laner Muchin, Ltd., on Friday, December 4, 2020, at the 36<sup>th</sup> Annual Illinois Public Sector Labor Relations Law Conference, hosted by the Chicago-Kent College of Law.

“The COVID-19 pandemic may seem as though it places us in uncharted legal waters,” Bradley said, “but there are constitutional principles that public employers can rely upon as they welcome employees back into the workspace.”
