- **Get an idea about the costs of their services up front**: Do you bill a flat fee or an hourly rate? Do you charge an annual fee?
- **Determine if the attorney can advise on what's best for you:** Can you explain the benefits of a will and revocable trust vs. a will and beneficiary designations? Can you tell me which one is better for my situation?
- What services will the attorney provide: Will you assist in funding a revocable trust, and if so, how much will you charge for this service?

Get a recommendation from a friend or relative who has an estate planning attorney. Ask your financial advisor or accountant for assistance in finding an estate planning attorney.
