

# OSHA to Delay Enforcement of Electronic Recordkeeping Rule Until November 1, 2016

This is an update to our July 6, 2016 post regarding OSHA's plan to enforce new rules concerning post-accident drug and alcohol testing. In response to a lawsuit filed to block the August 10<sup>th</sup> implementation of OSHA's new electronic recordkeeping rule (including the limits on post-accident drug and alcohol testing), OSHA announced yesterday that it will delay enforcement until November 1, 2016. There is no indication that OSHA will back away from its new stance on post-accident drug and alcohol testing, but enforcement will not begin until November 1, 2016.
