Washington, DC — Kathleen A. Kirby, co-chair of Wiley Rein's Telecom, Media & Technology Practice, was honored by the Federal Communications Bar Association (FCBA) last week with the 2018 "Distinguished Service Award." Ms. Kirby received the prestigious award during the FCBA's Summer Reception on June 28.

The award was presented to Ms. Kirby by FCBA President Julie Kearney, who also serves as Vice President of Regulatory Affairs at the Consumer Technology Association. Wiley Rein was a sponsor of the event, which was held at the Microsoft Innovation & Policy Center in Washington.

Ms. Kirby is a past recipient of the Radio Television Digital News Foundation's First Amendment Leadership Award, and was an inductee into the National Freedom of Information Act Hall of Fame. She has also been named one of the country's top 75 "Outstanding Women Lawyers" by *The National Law Journal*, and one of "Washington's Top Lawyers" by *Washingtonian* magazine.
