Washington, DC—Last week Wiley Rein welcomed a group of high school students from The Academies at Anacostia in Washington, DC, to its offices to learn first-hand what it means to be a lawyer. The firm has organized this special on-site program for four years in a row through its involvement with the National Association for Law Placement (NALP)/Street Law Legal Diversity Pipeline Program, which encourages high school students of all backgrounds to pursue careers in the law.

Twenty-one Wiley Rein lawyers joined together with in-house counsel from a client company to lead workshops enabling the students to delve into contracts law and a moot court case involving the Fourth Amendment. The on-site program at the firm was preceded by classroom visits at the school, in which students also were taught by Wiley Rein attorneys and in-house counsel. These sessions prepared them for the in-depth and interactive learning program held at the firm.
