McCaleb said. "They made life easier for me for sure."

When asked what motivates him, Mr. McCaleb pointed to the complexity of the cases he's asked to work on by in-house counsel. "In those instances, trying to find a solution to business problems through a legal mechanism really motivates me to go to work each day," he said.
